# Police Brutality: Research on Police Brutality

1. “Police violence disproportionately impacts young people, and the young people affected are disproportionately people of color,”

2. “We found absolutely no effect on white people when an unarmed black person is killed,” says Jacob Bor, a researcher at the Boston University School of Public Health. “We were not surprised by that finding. It speaks more to the specific nature of this exposure, in the way that it connects to both present and historical aspects of racism.”

# Police Brutality: comparison of responses and research

1. Both of my research and classmate responses agree that black people are the main target of police brutality.
2. Research claims that young black people are the ones affected, but my classmates believe that all black people no matter age or gender are affected by police brutality.
