
WHAT IS RACIAL DISCRIMINATION

Racial discrimination is any discrimination against individuals on the basis of their skin color, or racial or ethnic origin. Individuals can discriminate by refusing to do business with, socialize with, or share resources with people of a certain group.



WHOS MOST AFFECTED

About six-in-ten Americans (58%) say race relations in the U.S. are bad, and of those, few see them improving. Some 56% think the president has made race relations worse; just 15% say he has improved race relations and another 13% say he has tried but failed to make progress on this issue. In addition, roughly two-thirds say it's become more common for people to express racist views since Trump became president.




TREYVON MARTIN

Trayvon Benjamin Martin was a 17year-old African-American teenager from Miami Gardens, Florida, who was fatally shot in Sanford, Florida by George Zimmerman. Martin had gone with his father on a visit to his father's fiancée at her townhouse at The Retreat at Twin Lakes in Sanford. This man bought the police station over 100 mask. Yet he still ran away, possibly out of fear. Yet you can see in the video the respect the officers feel towards him




SOCIOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVE
