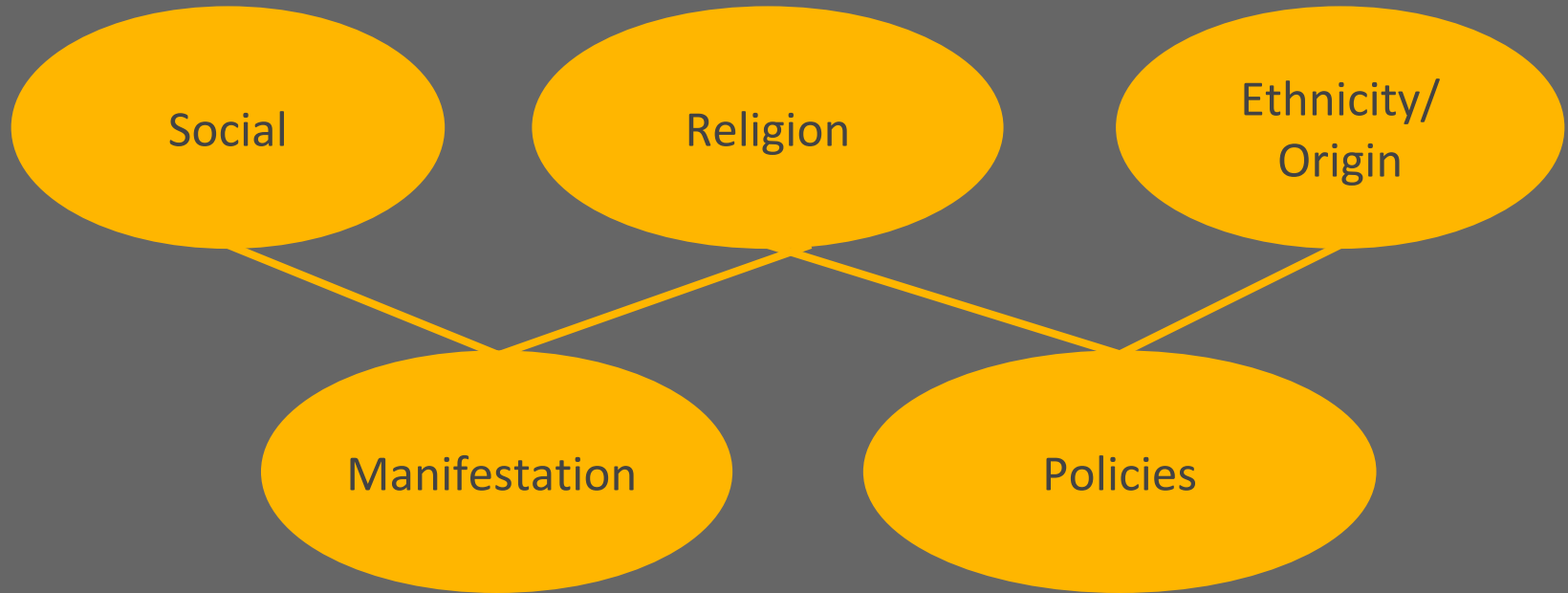

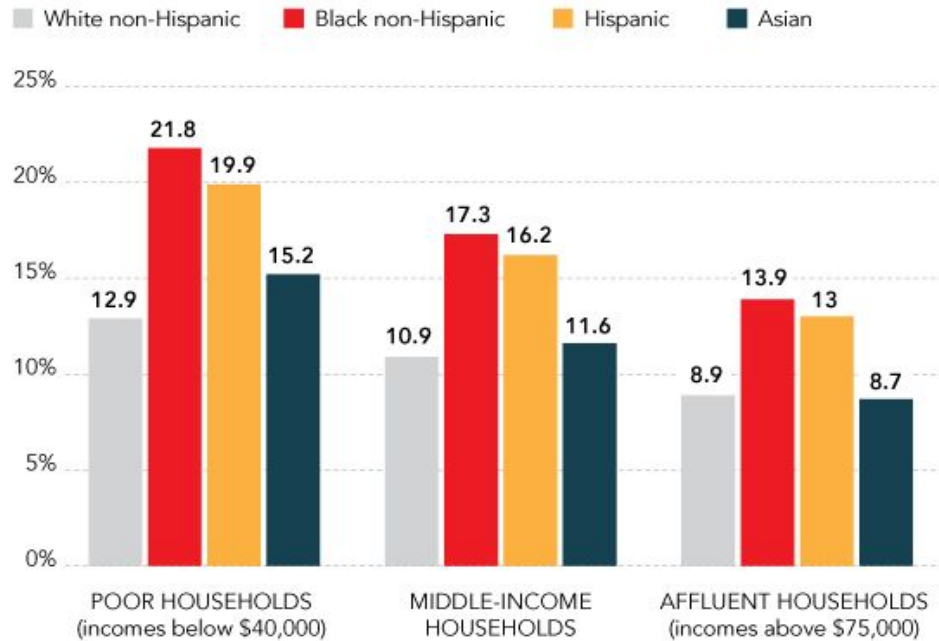


Policies

Black non-hispanic has the highest rates in poor households and also Hispanics, But they have a higher average in Middle-income and affluent households.

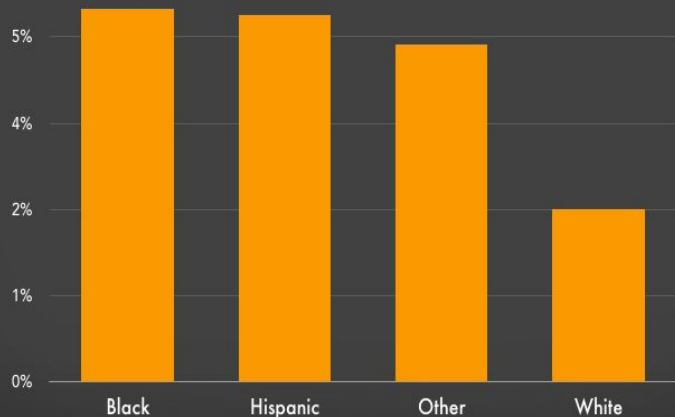
White non-hispanics and Asians both share the lowest rates for all categories
